Status of transportation improvement costs

The Board of the Roy Transportation Benefit District approved 2016 projects on August 24, 2015:

OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE for streets included on the City of Roy's Six Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program for the years 2015-2020:

- 1. \$1,500 to hire a contractor to make one trip to patch potholes as needed This allocation combined with allocations carried over from previous years to accomplish one trip to patch potholes at a cost of \$3,850.
- 2. \$3,000 to purchase traffic speed reduction or speed feedback signs The District contributed \$3,000 to the purchase of one Solar Evolis Radar Speed Sign.
- 3. \$3,000 to purchase 15% of a tractor to share with the water fund and an auger attachment The District contributed \$3,000 to the purchase of a Kubota tractor and a post digger attachment.

CONSTRUCTION for projects included on the City of Roy's Six Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program for the years 2015-2020:

The list of projects included setting aside \$4,785 to reserve matching funds for a future grant project.

Transportation improvement expenditures

2016 expenditures were \$3,000.00 for the Kubota tractor; \$3,850.00 for pothole repairs; \$3,000.00 for the speed sign; and \$8.78 for copies.

Revenues

The Washington State Department of Licensing collected \$20 vehicle fees and distributed revenue after retaining a fee of 1%. The City of Roy received \$14,196.57 for the District in 2016.
