Status of transportation improvement costs

The Board of the Roy Transportation Benefit District approved 2017 projects on October 10, 2016:

OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE for streets included on the City of Roy's Six Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program for the years 2017-2022:

1. \$2,000 to hire a contractor to make one trip to patch potholes as needed The state Transportation Improvement Board provided an Emergency Pavement Repair grant for this project, which cost \$7,742.84.

2. \$1,000 to replace missing, damaged or faded street signs The City purchased stop signs and school zone signs totaling \$610.32 without using District funding.

3. \$2,000 to purchase street sweeper attachment to tractor

The public works department found this impractical; research continues.

4. \$3,500 to purchase traffic speed reduction or speed feedback radar sign

The District contributed \$3,367.44 to the purchase of one Solar Evolis Radar Speed Sign.

CONSTRUCTION for projects included on the City of Roy's Six Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program for the years 2017-2022:

The list of projects included setting aside \$6,100 to reserve matching funds for a future grant project.

Transportation improvement expenditures

2017 expenditures were \$3,367.44 for the speed sign and \$1.45 for copies.

Revenues

The Washington State Department of Licensing collected \$20 vehicle fees and distributed revenue after retaining a fee of 1%. The City of Roy received \$16,354.80 in fees and \$88.75 in interest for the District in 2017.

Construction schedules

No construction project was scheduled.
