City of Roy Newsletter Update

The recent absence of a quorum at two requested Special Council Meetings has put several pending items at risk, potentially leading to financial burdens for the City of Roy. Key contracts and agreements requiring. approval by September 30, 2024, will impact service continuity and result in a potential lost of funding opportunities, including a crucial \$50,000 grant for the Comprehensive Plan Update.

Additionally, redundant costs may arise from multiple septic inspections due to unapproved bids, further straining the budget.

In related news, on September I9, the City collaborated with the Washington State Department of Ecology to expedite the transfer of water rights and address PFAS contamination. Plans are in place to drill Well #3, which will replace Well #2 and help meet future water demands while placing Well #I in emergency-only status. This approach not only saves time-eliminating up to six months of required paperwork-but also minimizes costs, with an estimated savings of \$60,000. Ongoing efforts include securing funding and designing treatment solutions to ensure safe drinking water for residents. A council vote on these initiatives is pending.

Additionally, information regarding the potential disbanding of the Roy Police Department will be presented at the upcoming meeting on October 2I. This discussion will provide important insights into the financial and community impacts of such a decision. We encourage all residents to stay informed and participate in these critical conversations.
